FY22 Scope of Work

The scope of work for Michigan Task Force 1 (MI-TF1) during fiscal year 2022 will continue to maintain and enhance Michigan's only Urban Search and Rescue (USAR) Type III and Type I Swiftwater capability, local USAR response capabilities AND upgrade equipment for MI-TF1.

USAR capabilities require knowledge, skills, and abilities to identify, respond, command, control and conduct search, rescue, and recovery operations that may include one or all USAR disciplines: structural collapse, rope rescue, extrication, confined space, emergency medical services, trench, hazmat and water operations.

Specifically, the scope of work will continue to include:

- Maintain MI-TF1's capabilities in compliance with FEMA including:
 - Personnel Training Requirements
 - Equipment Readiness
- Maintain MI-TF1 Single Resource Mission Ready Packages
- Maintain and Develop Statewide Partnerships
- Communicate MI-TF1's Capabilities to Michigan's first response community
- Validate Michigan Fire Service Special Operation Capabilities
- Upgrade Michigan's Notification Process for Fire Special Operations Resources
- Developing a statewide virtual Awareness and Position Specific training platform
- Provide local and regional fire departments with assistance during incidents
- Engage local USAR leadership in quarterly meetings and participate in local exercises

The additional funding to upgrade Urban Search and Rescue Equipment for Michigan Task Force-1 will be used to:

- Repair or replace communication and sheltering equipment and vehicles.
- Upgrade incident command capabilities for faster deployment and accountability
- Purchase new equipment to enhance overall USAR capabilities

MI-TF1 is a deployable intra- and interstate task force or mission specific single resource that meets the needs of local, state, or federal natural or man-made disasters.
